

Chairman's Report

Although hockey was again impacted by the Covid-19 pandemic, 2021 was ultimately a very successful season for Canterbury Hockey.

Our community came together again to successfully deliver meaningful local competitions, development programmes, official and unofficial representative teams, promotion of umpires and coaches, and host the inaugural Ōtautahi Cup. Canterbury Hockey received five awards at the Hockey New Zealand annual awards, including the Pakistan Trophy which was awarded to Peter Cox.

It is important to acknowledge the massively important part played by our members, particularly the clubs and schools, who understood the changing environment and the challenges our staff faced on the back of Government direction.

The sports environment is seeing an increasing number of sports working together to share initiatives and values which enhance the wider sporting environment. Canterbury Hockey advanced its work around Tū Manawa Active Aotearoa in association with Sport Canterbury. That programme essentially provides opportunities for tamariki and rangatahi who may not otherwise be able to participate due to circumstances.

Within the Canterbury area, hockey, along with football, rugby, rugby league, basketball and netball entered into an agreement to align season start dates for 2021. The rationale behind this agreement was to promote the wellbeing of young athletes, by having a break between seasons to mitigate against overload and the associated symptoms such as injury and burnout. The initiative was well accepted and allowed various codes to plan more effectively.

Canterbury Hockey has embraced

the Sport New Zealand initiative of the Balance is Better philosophy, which supports quality sport experiences for all young people, regardless of ability, needs and motivations. It is about young people staying involved in sport for life and realising their potential at the right time. The main focus is on rangatahi, given the decline we are seeing in teenage participation.

It is pleasing to report a very good working relationship with other associations and Hockey New Zealand. A positive outcome of the pandemic is the enthusiasm shown to put together unofficial interprovincial fixtures, as evidenced by the very successful Ōtautahi Cup.

Emma Hodgkin ended her time with us in the early part of 2021. We thank Emma for her work as Chief Executive and wish her the best for the future. In June 2021 we welcomed Shane Maddaford as our Chief Executive. Shane brings a wealth of knowledge, enthusiasm and understanding of the hockey culture. We wish him well in his time with Canterbury Hockey.

Our staff deserve high praise for their ongoing dedication and loyalty to our organisation. Over what has been a challenging period, with high expectations from the community, they have remained focussed on delivering the best outcomes for our members. A recently completed review of all operational aspects resulted in a number of changes to job roles, and some new appointments, aimed at further improving efficiency and delivery.

I would like to acknowledge the massive contribution of our volunteers. These people work across all facets of hockey and at all levels. Their work underpins what our sport is. Quite simply, without these highly valued people, we wouldn't be able to operate to the level we expect.

Canterbury Hockey is very grateful to have the support of Christchurch City Council, Selwyn District Council, and Waimakariri District Council. They provide key playing facilities; and also wider support in the delivery and promotion of hockey.

The recent increase in player numbers across Canterbury, and the prevailing popularity of hockey, means our existing facilities are stretched, and predicted further growth will likely see a shortage of facilities in just a few year's time. Late in 2020, the CHA and CAST Boards commenced a review of our existing facilities to develop a twenty year facilities strategy. The report identified time lines for new turf requirements at various locations. The first areas of focus are the replacement of the turfs at Nunweek Park, which are at or close to the end of their economic life, and a new turf at Rolleston, due for completion in May 2022.

The CHA Board commenced a review of the CHA Strategic Plan in late 2020. The intent was to release a new plan in 2021 but that was postponed as the decision was taken to align the new plan with that of Hockey New Zealand and ensure it was in line with that of the wider sports environment in New Zealand.

The financial position remains stable. Although we recorded a deficit of \$23,154, recent scrutiny and changes to operating of expenses, coupled with a focus on sponsor and funder relationships, gives a high degree of confidence in maintaining or improving our position in 2022. CHA continues to have a comparatively strong equity position. I would like to thank the work done by Janine Coates, our finance manager, in our finance space, and behind her the work of fellow Board members Martin Perry



and Murray Chesterman for their work on the Finance Committee. I want to thank our funders and sponsors for their continued support for Canterbury Hockey.

I have already acknowledged the CHA staff, led by Emma Hodgkin and Shane Maddaford, who all did a wonderful job in 2021. Ben Owers and Sam Grimshaw were absolutely committed to ensuring Community Player Development, Hockey, Development, Umpire and Competitions got all the attention needed to ensure a successful season. Shane's knowledge and enthusiasm has had a positive impact on the management and the wider hockey community, which I greatly appreciate. A big thank you must go to our Umpires, Competitions, Masters, and Junior Committees. These Committees face challenging requests from the community, management, and the Board. I acknowledge the sound direction they provided, and the

assistance they gave to the office and Board when called upon. I wish to thank the Judicial Committee for their very important work.

The management of CHA values very highly the relationship with the North West Community Trust and St Bede's College, the North Canterbury Sports Trust and Waikirikiri Hockey at Rolleston. Equally the Board of CHA appreciates the relationship with Canterbury Artificial Surfaces Trust (CAST), the Harewood Hockey Club, and the use and management of the Nunweek Park complex. The Board appreciates the ongoing support from its relationship with the CAST.

The annual Awards night attracted a large number of attendees, celebrating what was ultimately a very good season around the community hockey. The respective hockey awards can be found in the body of this report. Congratulations to all those who were honoured. I would like to thank my fellow Board members Simon Munt (Deputy Chair), Rachel Morrison, Murray Chesterman, Penny Gough and Martin Perry for their work in 2021. Nick Harris stepped down from the Board at the 2019 AGM, but willingly agreed to remain on the CHA finance comittee.

Our President and Awards Committee chair, Jeanette Harper, continues to provide sound backing and judgement when called upon.

We all wish for a more normal and stable season in 2022. The Board is reviewing the opportunities that exist for Canterbury Hockey and how they can benefit our sport. We look forward to further growing and promoting hockey in 2022.

Chief Executive's Report



Although it was another year full of disruption and uncertainty, I am not only extremely pleased to be the new CEO of Canterbury Hockey Association, but encouraged to report, in many ways 2021 was still a greatly successful year for our organisation and the community.

Our highlights include - successfully delivering the majority of our 2021 Club and School competitions, sending four U18 representative teams, and six officials away to the only national tournament of the year, delivering successful U13 and U15 development programmes, hosting the inaugural Otautahi Cup, introducing livestreamed hockey matches to our community, a total of 55 Junior and Community NZ Hockey Umpiring badges achieved, hosting the long awaited return of the CHA Golf Day, and we also finished the year with a number of great new staff appointments, ready to start 2022 with the new Canterbury Hockey Association team and staff structure - a great way to finish the year.

As mentioned, I have thoroughly enjoyed my appointment into this great role, with the opportunity to represent our community and region. It is a position I have and will continue to fill with genuine passion for our sport and our amazing Club and School community, and since June I have relished the opportunity to firstly understand, and now help shape and guide the direction of what is truly a talented, knowledgeable dedicated and community of players, coaches,

managers, officials, staff and volunteers. The level of support and excitement I have received to date is very much appreciated, and I look forward to continuing the success and momentum created into 2022.

Financial Results

Although our organisation delivered a positive financial result in 2020, we were realistic to the fact this outcome was largely achieved COVID-19 financial through support avenues such as MSD wage subsidies and Sport NZ Community Resilience Funding, and combined with the generosity extended by CAST regarding rent and Hockey NZ affiliation fee relief, it was clear that 2021 could potentially deliver similar financial challenges with the possibility of no support packages to offset any such loses.

Positively, 2021 did produce an improved revenue result from our hockey specific and delivery metrics – with Affiliation fees, Match and Practice turf fees and Programme Registrations, all largely uninterrupted, and in line with the delivery of our overall season.

Other key impacting factors to this financial result continue to be Grant funding, our Representative Programme and Sponsorship.

Although there was an improvement to our Grant Funding revenue result compared to 2020, the level obtained was still well below the generated income of 2019, and this aspect and area of our organisations financial model continues to prove very challenging and fragile, especially in the current environment that our Class 4 Gaming Funding partners are operating in. However, we were successful in continuing our strong funding relationship with our two largest partners in New Zealand Community Trust and Rātā Foundation. We are extremely appreciative for the shared vision and support we enjoy from these two amazing organisations, and also grateful for the continued support from our other funding partners – Mainland Foundation, Lion Foundation, Pub Charity, The Trust Community Foundation, and the returning support from Air Rescue Services and One Foundation – your generous funding and support in these challenging times means so much to our sport and community.

With the revised national representative calendar now only including the National U18 tournament and National Hockey Championship, although very disappointing, the cancellation of the NHC event delivered a reduced impact to our financial result. The high association cost involved with supporting our representative teams remains to be a significantly influencing factor for our full year result. Even with only two tournament campaigns each year, we endeavour to continue to reduce the overall costs to our players and organisation to the best of our ability.

The last of the key influencing factors to our financial model is our sponsorship revenue. In 2021 an encouraging result was achieved with levels close to what was generated in 2019. Over the last 12 months of challenging economic conditions we unfortunately lost a couple of our signage sponsors, but were fortunate enough to not only maintain most of our existing partnerships but we also entered into a number of new and exciting ones too, with Aqua Heat, Paladin, Motus Health, and New World Bishopdale all joining the CHA sponsorship whānau.

I must take this opportunity to not only thank our amazing sponsorship partners, but to also encourage our community to support these generous businesses who have chosen to investment funds and energy into our organisation and our community to help our sport continue to grow and be successful. Please join me in thanking – Ashton Wheelans, Ford Baker, Happy Hire, Harris Meats, House of Travel, CMG Sport, Crown Plaza and to our major sponsors – Just Hockey, Polytan, Connetics and Mike Greer Homes – your continued support for our community is greatly appreciated!

Excitement, innovation and planning is already well underway to maintain and further grow this important aspect of our operation, which I personally view as an excellent avenue to generate valuable mutual benefits for all organisations, especially ones already part of our loyal hockey community.

With all revenue and expense areas being thoroughly reviewed in recent times, we have a solid level of confidence in the more controllable aspects of the model, with renewed planning and innovation being exercised and explored in our other key variable areas likes Grant Funding and Sponsorship, there is an increased possibility of turning around the 2021 deficit of \$23,154 into a successful 2022.

Delivering Hockey for our Community

Despite all the influencing factors, challenges, restrictions, and everchanging government guidelines 2021 threw at us, the delivery of our sport, competitions, and events to our community was something the CHA team should be very proud of, and the foundation achieved by our team holds us in great stead for an even better season ahead.

The team has become quite accustomed to being nimble, fastthinking, and innovative when it comes to the delivery of our sport in the current climate, and those are the great attributes that came into play, predominately throughout the second half of the year, when we were again forced to adapt the original plan for the season.

The dedication and commitment shown by the staff was highlighted with the successful delivery of a number of new and modified events and competitions. With the August lockdown hitting the country and our region just one day prior to the commencement of our finals week, we managed to return and complete most of the remaining fixtures, with 35% of our final round Senior Club competition matches played and an impressive 89% of final round Secondary School matches completed – a true testament to the passion and love for the game our community has.

Our Association and region also enjoyed hosting a number of key events throughout the year, with the delivery of Mainland Cup across our U18 and senior levels in June. Post lockdown came the revised iteration of our U15 development programme which saw the Balance is Better philosophy incorporated into the structure and direction of the new South Island U15 Tournament. This hugely successful five day event delivered tournament style hockey within a development focused environment to 27 teams, over 84 matches, across 10 Associations, providing positive progression and enjoyment for over 400 players and 16 umpires - all executed by our dedicated CHA staff and led by our Development Leader - Ben Owers, well done and thank you so much team!

The final event hosted in Christchurch came a year earlier than I envisioned, when the team and I set about forming a new and exciting relationship with Wellington and Otago Hockey Associations. The goal was to create an annual four team tournament here in Christchurch for our top men's and woman's teams to provide a tournament like environment in preparation for the National Hockey Championship each year. With the cancellation of the 2021 NHC confirmed, we set about bringing the idea to reality, and the inaugural Ōtautahi Cup was hosted for the first time at Ngā Puna Wai, which was won by our Canterbury Cats and Cavaliers, and is now set to be the annual fixture in our representative calendar for our top teams.

Connecting our Hockey Community

Coming into this role, I had a clear vision and goal to firstly create a community focused CHA staff structure filled with talented and dedicated team members, who I could encourage to develop and grow a genuine connection with our wonderful Canterbury Hockey community. This approach will set us up to produce a strong and sustainable collaborative relationship between our community of Clubs and Schools, a result that will see Canterbury Hockey Association reach a level of excellence unmatched across our game - a long term vision I am extremely passionate about.

With the staff restructuring exercise completed in late 2021, I believe as a team, we are now well positioned to achieve our ultimate goal of a strong and sustainable community connection. We also look forward to providing further innovation on the back of the momentum created through initiatives and events like the 'Let's Keep it Positive' campaign tackling side line behaviour, which saw our CHA staff and Club members advocating and celebrating positive messaging to our players, coaches and officials.

The return of our annual CHA Golf Day was well received by our community, so much so that the event capacity at Russley Golf Club was exceeded in just 3 weeks, prompting immediate planning for a bigger and better

event in November 2022.

The trial with CelloSport also provided another excellent connection for our region with livestreaming of 10 matches over our delayed finals week, again proving how strong our community connection can be with over 13,200 views of these matches, motivating CHA and CelloSport to enter into a new partnership that will see regular School and Club matches livestreamed every week in 2022 for our community and commercial partners to enjoy.

Strengthening our Business

As outlined above, the absolute key and number one factor to achieving the strongest possible business and future for our association is our staff. The team structure review process completed at the back end of 2021 proved to be tremendously valuable and has seen the creation of three new and exciting roles which were successfully filled from within our hockey whānau by Joe Piggott (Community Participation Manager), Chris Leslie (Talent Development Manager) and Campbell Ross (Officials Development Officer).

The recruitment of these well respected candidates now provides an excellent structure and foundation for the organisation to best service, develop and grow our clubs, schools and wider community into the future.

From a facilities aspect, with the continued growth of our sport within the region, I am pleased to advise we are set to welcome the newest full sized turf to our network with the development of Foster Park in Rolleston, which is set to be completed and ready for most of the 2022 season.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the amazing volunteers we have in our community that have provided so much support and dedication to the sport

we all love. From our Club and administrators, School coaches. managers, officials, and volunteers and the endless commitment you show towards your teams is truly appreciated. To our extremely valuable advisory committees that help provide insights and direction to all aspects of our game, and to the leaders within these groups, your experience and knowledge is absolutely priceless and very much appreciated by myself, the staff, and the CHA Board - Murray, Nick, Amanda, Rachel, John, and Kerry – thank you all so much!

We are very lucky have a great network of partners that support our Association and sport. Without the likes of Sport Canterbury, Christchurch City Council, and Hockey New Zealand the delivery of our game would look very different and extremely difficult to navigate, especially within the current climate and the size of our growing community – your support, funding and shared passion for Hockey and its success is amazing and sincerely appreciated.

I would also like to acknowledge the commitment of the Trusts involved with our all-important facilities, to the Ngā Puna Wai Trust for their continued work on the development and direction of the wonderful facilities we enjoy as a Partnered Sport, and to the Canterbury Artificial Surfaces Trust for your investment of energy and passionate for our trio of turfs at Nunweek Park. I'm sure you are all excited about the future and the proposed transformation of this great facility.

For a sporting organisation of our size to continue to grow and remain successful for so long requires an experienced and dedicated Board, which we are extremely lucky to have. I would like to thank Mark, Simon, Murray, Rachel, Penny and Martin for two aspects – firstly, for the level of knowledge and genuine consideration you all have for our association and the community we serve is not only a testament to you as Board members, but also to you all as proud members of the community too. Also, I would like to acknowledge the amount of support and encouragement you have given me personally since joining the team, thank you!

Finally, to our amazing staff. As a community we should be very proud of our staff and the endless amount of effort and enthusiasm we each put into the success of the organisation to deliver the best hockey product and experience possible.

On behalf of the Board and myself, I would sincerely like to thank our entire 2021 team – contracted, Venue Supervisor, part or full time, you have each contributed so much for our community and organisation.

A special mention and farewell to James and Janine, you have both played a significant role within our team and I thank you both so much. To Aaron, Jess (welcome back Lucy), Steve, Campbell, Chris, Sam and especially Ben - your commitment and dedication to our team and the community is not only greatly valued, but very much appreciated. I look forward to working with you all, welcoming Joe and Heidi, and continuing to grow on the momentum generated and take our team and hockey delivery to the next level.

Thanks again to our wonder Canterbury Hockey community we all enjoy serving and representing. Your support, encouragement and passion for our sport is truly amazing, and I look forward to leading our association with pride into what is shaping up to be a great 2022 season.

Community Hockey Development

2021 proved to be another challenging year for the Canterbury Hockey community with COVID-19 restrictions impacting the delivery of various competitions, events, and programmes. With government enforced gathering limits and eventually a lockdown in August, we were grateful to get through all but the last weekend of the scheduled winter season and deliver most of our planned development focused initiatives.

Participation Programmes

Our Small Sticks in-schools programme was continued in 2021, with a focus on delivering to schools in areas with high potential for participation growth. Despite a lot of rescheduled delivery due to alert level changes, a total of ten schools and 1,875 children took part in the programme. In addition to the traditional in-school delivery, we also supported the delivery of North Canterbury Sports Trust 'have a go days', Selwyn Sport Trust winter sports programme, The Elmwood Club's winter sports programme, and MASH school holiday programmes, which provided an additional 1,061 children with exposure to hockey.

On top of Canterbury Hockey's efforts to expose more young people to hockey and grow the sport, a number of our clubs supported us with the delivery of their own programmes. Once again, Fun Sticks programmes were delivered by nine clubs to a total of 260 year 1 and 2 school-aged children. While both Hurunui and Waikirikiri delivered social and skill development programmes to new players of all ages.

Outside of traditional hockey programmes, Canterbury Hockey also formed a partnership with Canterbury Cricket, Touch Canterbury, Squash Canterbury and the Northwest Collective of Community Trusts, Networks and Organizations to deliver the Kia Kori Waitaha initiative. This initiative aimed to get more of our young people active, and targeted those that typically miss out on these opportunities. Led by Canterbury Cricket Participation Activators, this programme was delivered in schools, holiday programmes, community groups, and events and created over 20,400 participations.

Development Programmes

Following on from the removal of under 13 and 15 representative teams in 2020, 2021 was the first year in which new regional and South Island based programmes and events could be delivered. For under 13 players, this involved a training camp in the July school holidays and a Christchurch based regional festival from October 1st to 3rd. This festival hosted a total of 27 teams (16 x 7 a-side and 11 x 11 a-side), including four Mid Canterbury, seven South Canterbury and 20 Canterbury teams, for a total of approximately 300 players.

Under 15 players also took part in a training camp during the July school holidays, but the event component looked quite different, with an internal Canterbury Districts Festival and a Christchurch based South Island under 15 Tournament delivered. The Canterbury District Festival involved 25 Canterbury girls who were split into district-based teams to play both Hockey 5's and 11 a-side matches on September

24th and 25th. Whilst the South Island Tournament took place from October 3rd to 7th and involved 27 teams (14 girls and 13 boys) from associations all around the South Island. Canterbury was fortunate to have four teams per gender and a total of 121 players involved.

With the various challenges put forward by COVID-19, plus a huge amount of time put into the planning and implementation of new under 13 and 15 programmes, a stretch on staff resources meant that both coach and club development opportunities were limited in comparison to previous years. Some coach development took place, with total of eight coaching workshops delivered to 77 coaches, while mentoring was provided by trained Developers to over 20 coaches during both the under 13 and 15 development events. Club Development was delivered in a new format in 2021, with University of Canterbury Hockey Club being the sole club to complete the new programme.

In the end, 2021 provided us with a number of things to be proud of in the community development space and a lot of it once again came down to the positive way in which our community responded to some challenging times. A special mention and thank you needs to be extended to our Advisory Committees, the Youth Development Working Group, and everyone else who volunteered their time as a coach, umpire, administrator, or supporter of hockey in Canterbury.

Offer Meaningful Competitions

In 2021 our competitions again played a key role in delivering a high-quality playing experience to our community. After team numbers dropped in 2020 it was encouraging to see more players come back to the game in 2021 and thrive in the competitive nature of our competitions.

2021 gave us a near unaffected season barring the final round of matches where COVID-19 pushed matches back by a month. Through the resilience of our community and determination to push forward we completed the season in September which is a real credit to our Clubs and Schools and helped to cap off what was another successful season. Our Senior, School, and Platinum grades saw a growth of five teams with most of this growth coming from the women's grades. We continued our growth of having teams compete from outside of the city boundaries by including teams from Mid, South and North Canterbury all adding to the success of the competitions and growth of the game.

Senior Hockey

Competitiveness between teams in our senior divisions were at an all-time high in 2021 with some amazing talent on display. In the Canterbury Premier League (CPL) we saw the Harewood women take out the regular season Hinemoa Cup and back this up in the finals series to win the Championship Cup over Marist and complete the three-peat by retaining the women's Challenge Shield for the entirety of the season. The men's competition came down to the very last weekend of regular season games to decide the play offs, with Harewood coming out on top and winning the Presidents Shield and keeping hold of the Challenge Shield to end the 2021 season. High School Old Boys Burnside snuck into the playoffs in fourth place and produced a magical run to win both

their semi-final and final, resulting in them taking home the men's CPL Champion Trophy.

Secondary School Hockey

Canterbury Hockey continued its proud history of having one of the most highly competitive Secondary competitions School in the country. Friday nights drew crowds throughout the season at Ngā Puna Wai and the players did not disappoint with high quality skill and school pride on display every single night. The boy's competition saw Christ College defend their 2020 title while in the girls Rangi Ruru went unbeaten throughout the season to win the championship. Rangi Ruru did the double be retaining the Challenge Shield through the season while St Bedes held the Challenge Shield for the entire season.

Platinum Hockey

Platinum hockey numbers remained steady in 2021 with the quality increased by a drive to have year 11 play in this grade instead of moving into senior grades. Quality coaches and a newly developed Under 15 programs saw these players experience a positive season with a competitive and development focused balance in their game.

Junior Hockey

Our junior competitions saw the biggest changes in 2021 with the first phase of implementing 7-a-side hockey for year 7s before including year 8s in 2022. Clubs and Schools need to be praised for their positive attitude towards the change and the benefits we saw to player development in this space. 186 teams competed in Canterbury Hockey junior competitions on a Saturday morning across 14 venues ranging from year 3s right up to year 8s.

Masters Hockey

The Canterbury Hockey Masters Community is a really engaged group of people that love to play our game. Locally women over 30 and men over 35 can compete in the competition currently comprising of 12 and 16 teams respectively, running from October to February. Masters Hockey is a space that continues to grow as more people are drawn back to hockey and the Masters Committee need high praise for the work they put in to make this a successful area of our game.

Summer Hockey

The social 6-a-side and 11-a-side grades are mixed gender competitions giving our participants opportunities over the summer to play hockey. These competitions are now spread across both Nunweek Park and Ngā Puna Wai to capture more demographics which is fantastic for the growth of the game.

Administration

A big thank you needs to go out to the relevant advisory committees for assisting in the smooth running of our competitions. These committees are our Competitions, Junior, Masters and Umpire Committees.



Development Network

Our new Canterbury Hockey Development Network was piloted at the end of 2020 for those athletes aged over 16 years and who were identified as on a development pathway. This initiative was able to align with the Hockey New Zealand programme, giving athletes the opportunity to get a taste of the next step in their playing journey.

The programme was continued this year with Block One delivered in November – December. The network was designed to provide a high quality and unique opportunity for Canterbury Hockey current Premier League players and Secondary School Premier Division 1 players (over 16 years' of age) to improve fitness, enhance skill development, and receive coaching in small groups from Canterbury's leading coaches.

Chris Leslie from GOALab Hockey was contracted to coordinate and led the programme with input and coaching support from other top Canterbury coaches. Sessions provided a great opportunity for field players and goal keepers to gain a competitive edge during the offseason and get a glimpse of what the performance development pathway looked like. Programme Timing and Delivery Sessions ran twice per week (Monday and Wednesday) at Ngā Puna Wai with support from the Hockey New Zealand Performance Network. The Programme Content Sessions consisted of:

- Drills to enhance core skills.
- Conceptional training that allowed players to implement skills in both offensive and defensive scenarios.
- Games where players were given opportunities to execute skills in match situations and make good decisions under pressure.
- Drills as games also contained a conditioning element to help players prepare physically.
- Specialist goal keeping training was included in the sessions.

The programme was well received by players and was attended by over 40 participants, particularly by young men. The intention is to continue to refine and offer Block Two of this programme again in 2022.

Representative

Our Canterbury Hockey representative teams competed in only one national tournament, the National Under 18s with the National Senior Championships cancelled due to COVID-19.

It has been two years since the last National U18 event. This year's tournament saw the return of Association-based competition. The National U18 Tournament became the first national tournament opportunity for all players/umpires/ coaches/managers and allowed an opportunity to 'stick your hand up' on the national stage.

The Vantage National U18 Women's Tournament saw 21 Association teams descend on Wellington to compete for the Amanda Hooper Memorial Trophy. The National U18 Men's Tournament saw 20 Association teams make their way to Hamilton to compete for the Paul Ackerley Memorial Trophy. The tournament format was very cutthroat with only the winners of each pool progressing to a semifinal.

Canterbury entered a women's A and B team in the competition. The A's played some great hockey and were unfortunate not to make the final. They defeated Waikato in their final match finishing in 3rd place. The B team had a fantastic tournament with their only loss being against joint tournament winners North Harbour. The team finished a very credible 9th. One memory of the tournament will be the appalling weather conditions on the final day with several matches being abandoned, including the final. Canterbury also entered a men's A and B team in their tournament. The A's were on fire during pool play scoring 27 goals and not conceding one. After beating Otago in the semi, they were extremely competitive in the final against North Harbour. Unfortunately, they were defeated and finished in 2nd place. The B's also performed incredibly well. Their results showed how competitive the tournament was, with only losing once, they finished in 10th place.

Unfortunately, the National Senior Championships were cancelled for the second consecutive year due to COVID-19. However Canterbury Hockey introduced the Ōtautahi Cup. This was played in Christchurch between Canterbury, Otago, and Wellington. The Canterbury Cats and Cavaliers were the eventual winners of the Ōtautahi Cup.

COVID-19 Despite restrictions Canterbury Hockey were still able to deliver numerous meaningful tournaments across the year. In the Under 13's space (previously Collier and Hatch Cup) we were able to successfully deliver a Canterbury region wide festival, catering for 27 teams and approximately 300 athletes across three venues. Following the Under 13's we hosted the inaugural South Island Under 15 Festival, with 430 athletes across 27 teams playing 84 games. A big thank you goes to the Ben Owers, Campbell **Ross, and James-Paul Mountstevens** who worked tirelessly to ensure these events were a success.

The Mainland Cup and the inaugural Ōtautahi Cup are now regulars in the Canterbury Hockey Events calendar and helped showcase the skills of our top players in a representative environment. The Mainland Cup was played over Queens Birthday weekend at Ngā Puna Wai. Canterbury and Otago Senior Men and Women and Under 18 Men and Women competed in the competition. Canterbury was deserving winners and successfully retained the Mainland Cup without losing a match. The event was played in great spirit, and also included an evening function for all teams, and a shared meal after the games were completed on the final day.

2021 saw the inaugural Ōtautahi Cup played in Christchurch. The Cup was kindly donated by Rangiora Eye Care. The competition was contested between Canterbury Senior A and B Men's and Women's teams, Otago, and Wellington Senior Men's and Women's teams. The Cup has been introduced to provide competition as a build up to the National Hockey Championship. Unfortunately, the

2021 again saw COVID-19 affect Championship was cancelled for the second consecutive year due to COVID-19. This year's Ōtautahi Cup included several current Black Sticks and Performance Network members. Crowd numbers were limited due to COVID-19 restrictions but the addition of live streaming through Sky Sport helped boost viewership numbers from around the country. The combined Canterbury results meant the Canterbury Cats and Cavaliers were the eventual winners.

Finals Weekend

After a one-month delay between semi-finals and finals it was important that Canterbury Hockey finished the season in a meaningful fashion over finals weekend. The biggest positive from the weekend was the introduction of CelloSport, a live streaming, fully automated, unmanned camera to help capture the games for all to see. Viewing numbers were right up there with other productions by CelloSport, and it is going to be a great investment for live streaming at Ngā Puna Wai in the 2022 season. Final's weekend saw some fantastic matches with exciting finishes to cap off what was again another abnormal but successful season.

Awards Night

The final event (albeit later than originally scheduled!) was the Canterbury Hockey Awards dinner. We were again privileged to be able to hold this event at Tait's Technology Centre and sold out right up to the maximum capacity we were allowed. It was amazing to be able to celebrate individual, team and club success and pay tribute to the volunteers that make our game such a success. Congratulations to all finalist and winners and a big thank you to James-Paul Mountstevens the MC on the night and did a fantastic job keeping the crowd entertained

and capping off a successful 2021 season.

Canterbury Hockey Golf Day

An event previously lost from the Canterbury Hockey calendar was resurrected in 2021, this was the successful Golf Day! 16 teams of four competed at Russley Golf Course for bragging rights within the community and to help raise money for Canterbury Hockey community initiatives on a scorcher of a day. Officials Report

Despite continuous delays. disruptions, and uncertainty caused by the seemingly endless pandemic, Canterbury global Hockey's Umpires and Technical Officials managed to complete a successful year and helped to ensure a high quality hockey experince was delivered in 2021. With international opportunities scarce for Canterbury's top Officials, due to forced cancellations globally, and a new sponsor (Aquaheat New Zealand Ltd.) the umpire space began to get a bit of a reboot.

Not wanting to see another year go by without tournament opportunities, Canterbury managed to host three events that ensured continued development of our Officials Community (Canterbury Region Under 13's, South Island Under 15's and The Ōtautahi Cup). With all three giving locals the chance to take on more challenging management roles, such as Tournament Directing and Umpire Managing. At both National tournaments in 2021, Canterbury Umpires and Match Directors were appointed to Gold and Bronze medal matches across the country; an incredible achievement for all.

2021 saw a push by the Canterbury Hockey team to encourage and enrich the Junior and Community Umpiring space. With the numbers in both areas dwindling in recent years, by end of the season, over 60 Juniors and 30 Community Umpires had been to at least one CHA Development Workshop, with 36 Juniors and 19 Community Umpires passing their New Zealand Hockey Badges. This is 52 more than in 2019.

A massive thank you to all of the umpiresandofficials, both Juniorand Senior, that reliably and dependably turned up each week, accepted development opportunities, learned and grew over 2021. The Association cannot run without your time and dedication.

Canterbury Artificial Surfaces Trust Report

Canterbury Artificial Surfaces Trust (CAST) did not make any major changes to the facilities at Nunweek Park during the year but initial planning for a turf replacement on Number 2 and a major revamp of Number 1 turf took place. These two projects will take place at the conclusion of the 2022 season but planning for these major projects is well under way. We continue to monitor the Number 3 turf with a view to its future replacement and are working with Canterbury Hockey address some performance to issues that have been raised. CAST continues to monitor and provide input into the development of hockey facilities around the Canterbury region.

Financial Performance

The charge to Canterbury Hockey for use of the Nunweek Park turfs was maintained at the same level (\$70,000 per turf). The Trust made a \$10,000 contribution to a Canterbury Hockey initiated independent review of hockey facilities during the year. The Trust had a deficit of \$31,000 before accounting for depreciation, for the year ended 30 September 2021. Interest from term deposits was greatly reduced from the previous year due to the donation towards the construction of Ngā Puna Wai having been made. While we have good cash reserves, the Trust will be seeking further funding to complete the Nunweek Park turf projects later in 2022.

Conclusion

Thank you to the Trustees for their continued commitment. During the year we were delighted to appoint Diana Te Awa as a Trustee. The Trustees are; Ian Riach, Nick Harris, Peter Cox, Diana Te Awa and Selwyn Maister. CAST is seeking to appoint a further Trustee with financial skills to take over Peter Cox's role on the Trust. Peter is going to be overseas for a period early in 2022 and we are taking the opportunity to allow him to retire from the Treasurer role, while still remaining as a Trustee. Peter has been on CAST since it was formed in 2000.

During the year, Canterbury Hockey had a change in their Chief Executive and Emma Hodgkin was replaced by Shane Maddaford. Cooperation with Canterbury Hockey is essential for the efficient operation of CAST and I thank both Emma and Shane for a smooth transfer. I also wish to thank Canterbury Hockey Board Chair, Mark Beatson, for the continued excellent level of cooperation and communication that he has provided throughout the year.
